- Provide leadership and support for the development of research for acceptance into peer reviewed journals, other publications, and conference presentations.

- PhD in Economics, with speciality training in Health Economics and affiliation with an academic institution;
- Knowledge of current and emerging healthcare delivery systems and solid understanding of policy issues;
- Knowledge of clinical, administrative and system issues with respect to patient-based funding and health system funding reform;
- Recognized as an opinion leader within the professional community;
- Experience in leadership positions at provincial, regional and/or local level;
- Ability to interpret information, make sound decisions and communicate these to clinical and non-clinical audiences;
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, and ability to build consensus.
